

ORDINANCE NO. BOH-2- 2017

Please take notice that the following Ordinance was adopted on first reading by the Board of Health of the Township of Kingwood, County of Hunterdon, State of new Jersey, at a meeting held on the 16th day of August 2017. The Ordinance was then ordered to be published according to law. Notice is hereby given that the said Ordinance will be considered for final passage after a public hearing to be held on the 18th day of October, 2017, at a meeting beginning at 7:30 P.M. at the Municipal Building located on the corner of County Road 519 and Oak Grove Road, Kingwood Township, New Jersey, at which time all interested parties will be heard.

ORDINANCE AMENDING PART III “BOARD OF HEALTH LEGISLATION,” OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF KINGWOOD, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, AND THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO CREATE CHAPTER 150 ENTITLED “PORTABLE CHEMICAL TOILETS”.

WHEREAS, the Township Committee wishes to create Section 150 of the Ordinance to establish regulations for the use of portable chemical toilets; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Kingwood, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1:

Section 150 shall be added as followings:

**Chapter 150
Portable Chemical Toilets**

§150-1 Permit Required for Installation

No person, firm or corporation shall install, provide or permit the installation, furnishing or operation of a portable chemical toilet within the Township unless a permit therefor is first obtained from the Board of Health. Such license shall be posted in a conspicuous place on the premises. Kingwood Township or individuals/organizations renting Township facilitates for an event shall be exempt from the permit requirement.

§150-2 Cost of Permit; Renewal

The cost of a permit shall be:

- For 7 days or less: \$5 per toilet
- For 7 days to 12 months: \$25 per toilet.

The cost for a permit renewal shall be \$5.00 for 7 days or less and \$25.00 for 7 days to 12 months.

§150-3 Length of Use Restricted.

A portable chemical toilet shall be allowed only for temporary use not exceeding twelve (12) months except that a renewal of a license may be obtained where the continued temporary use is shown to the satisfaction of the Board of Health to be necessary.

§150-4 Sanitation and Maintenance.

- A. The portable chemical toilet shall be used only so long as field sanitation and maintenance service is provided. This shall include pumping out all waste matter from the tank, sterilizing and recharging tank with fresh chemicals, fresh supply of toilet tissue and thorough cleaning of premises, throughout the entire period of use of the portable chemical toilet.
- B. Reports shall be maintained which detail a record of all maintenance and/or cleaning. The report shall include dates when toilet is pumped, sterilized, cleaned and/or supplies

are restocked. A copy of this report shall be provided to the Township Board of Health on a monthly basis.

§150-5 Permitted Locations

The portable chemical toilet is intended to be used and to be permitted for such purposes as sport events, picnics, parades, construction operations and for similar purpose where other toilet facilities are not feasible and the need for toilet facilities exists.

§150-6 Disposal of Waste Matter.

The waste matter from all portable chemical toilets shall be disposed of and properly treated only at a sewage treatment plant, and no wastes from a portable chemical toilet shall be otherwise disposed of within the limits of the Township. (BH Ord. passed 3-23-81, § 6)

§150-7 Subject to Inspection.

Portable chemical toilet facilities and disposal of waste therefrom shall be subject to inspection and investigation and the same shall be permitted to representatives of the Board of Health at all times.

§150-8 Violation; Penalty.

Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall upon conviction thereof be subject to the provisions of Chapter 1-15. Each day a particular violation continues shall constitute of a separate offense.

Section 2:

If any part or parts of this ordinance are for any reason held to be invalid such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 3:

All ordinances or parts of ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are repealed but only to the extent of such inconsistency. All other parts of the Code of the Township of Kingwood not inconsistent herewith are ratified and confirmed.

Section 4:

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final adoption and publication according to law.
