CALL TO ORDER

NEW AND PENDING MATTERS

Draft Ordinance – Amending Definition of Potable Water

The current ordinance provides for a definition of potable water as any water used or intended to be used for drinking or culinary purposes. The draft ordinance provides for a definition of potable water as any water used or intended to be used for drinking or culinary purposes. Potable water line flushing and discharges from potable water sources owned or operated by the Township of Kingwood are eligible non-stormwater discharges in accordance with the Tier B MS4 NJDEP Master General Permit NJ0141861. This, however, excludes discharge of filter backwash and certain discharges from well development and redevelopment activities. The reason for the amended definition is to bring the ordinance in compliance with the new Stormwater Management Regulations.

It was moved by P. Mikes, seconded by T. Ciacciarelli and carried to introduce on first reading Ordinance No. BOH -01-2018:

ORDINANCE AMENDING PART III “BOARD OF HEALTH LEGISLATION,” OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF KINGWOOD, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, AND THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO CREATE CHAPTER 153 ENTITLED SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS; NONPUBLIC WATER SYSTEMS AND WELLS

All members present voted **AYE**.

Draft Ordinance – Repealing Chapter 150 – Portable Chemical Toilets

T. Ciacciarelli stated the ordinance was introduced as a result of an issue with a facility on Route 12. It is difficult to enforce. There is no one driving through the Township looking for portable chemical toilets. Since the time of its adoption, no one has applied for a permit. The amount charged for the permit is less than it would cost to enforce the ordinance. He recommends the Board repeal the ordinance.

It was moved by P. Mikes, seconded by T. Ciacciarelli and carried to introduce on first reading Ordinance No. BOH-02-2018:

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING PART III “BOARD OF HEALTH LEGISLATION” OF THE GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF KINGWOOD, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON AND THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY CREATING CHAPTER 150 ENTITLED “PORTABLE CHEMICAL TOILETS.”

All members present voted **AYE**.

Draft Ordinance – Adding Foot Note to Chapter 153, Table 1

D. Laudenbach explained the purpose of the amendment to Table 1 is to allow individuals who are constructing an ECHO Housing Unit on their property be permitted to forego the three part pump test required by the Ordinance. The requirement creates an undue financial hardship on the resident and the increase in water usage should be minimal.

It was moved by J. Golden, seconded by R. Phillips and carried to introduce on first Ordinance No. BOH-03-2018:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 153 SEWAGE DISPOSAL SYSTEMS, 153 ATTACHMENT 1, TABLE 1, APPLICABILITY AND TIMING FOR TYPES OF WATER USE

All in members present voted **AYE**.

The secretary was instructed to convey to the Strykers that the Board has acknowledged the situation and are monitoring the progress with the County Health Department.
