RESOLUTION NO. 2009 – 82

TO AFFIRM THE TOWNSHIP OF KINGWOOD’S CIVIL RIGHTS POLICY WITH RESPECT TO ALL OFFICIALS, APPOINTEES, EMPLOYEES, PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEES, VOLUNTEERS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC THAT COME INTO CONTACT WITH MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES, OFFICIALS AND VOLUNTEERS

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Township of Kingwood to treat the public, employees, prospective employees, appointees, volunteers and contractors in a manner consistent with all applicable civil rights laws and regulations including, but not limited to the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964 as subsequently amended, the New Jersey Law against Discrimination, the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Conscientious Employee Protection Act; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood has determined that certain procedures need to be established to accomplish this policy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ADOPTED by the Kingwood Township Committee that:

Section 1: No official, employee, appointee or volunteer of the Township by whatever title known, or any entity that is in any way a part of the Township shall engage, either directly or indirectly in any act including the failure to act that constitutes discrimination, harassment or a violation of any person’s constitutional rights while such official, employee, appointee volunteer, or entity is engaged in or acting on behalf of the Township’s business or using the facilities or property of the Township.

Section 2: The prohibitions and requirements of this Resolution shall extend to any person or entity, including but not limited to any volunteer organization or inter-local organization, whether structured as a governmental entity or a private entity, that receives authorization or support in any way from the Township to provide services that otherwise could be performed by the Township.

Section 3: Discrimination, harassment and civil rights shall be defined for purposes of this Resolution using the latest definitions contained in the applicable Federal and State laws concerning discrimination, harassment and civil rights.

Section 4: The Kingwood Township Employee Handbook and Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual establishes written procedures for any person to report alleged discrimination, harassment and violations of civil rights prohibited by this Resolution. Such procedures include alternate ways to report a complaint so that the person making the complaint need not communicate with the alleged violator in the event the alleged violator would be the normal contact for such complaints.

Section 5: No person shall retaliate against any person who reports any alleged discrimination, harassment or violation of civil rights, provided however, that any person who reports alleged violations in bad faith shall be subject to appropriate discipline.

Section 6: The Kingwood Township Employee Handbook and Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual establishes written procedures that require all officials, employees, appointees and volunteers of the Township as well as all other entities subject to this Resolution to periodically complete training concerning their duties, responsibilities and rights pursuant to this Resolution.

Section 7: The Kingwood Township Employee Handbook and Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual establishes a system to monitor compliance and reporting at least annually to the Township Committee the results of the monitoring.

Section 8: At least annually, a summary of this Resolution and the procedures established pursuant to this Resolution shall be communicated within the Township. This communication shall include a statement from the Township Committee expressing its unequivocal commitment to enforce this Resolution. This summary shall also be posted on the Township's web site.

Section 9: This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

Section 10: A copy of this Resolution shall be published in the Hunterdon County Democrat in order for the public to be made aware of this policy and the Township’s commitment to the implementation and enforcement of this policy.

Resolution Establishing the Sustainable Kingwood Team

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood strives to save tax dollars, assure clean air and water, improve working and living environments to build a community that is sustainable economically and environmentally, a community which will thrive well into the new century; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood wishes to build a model of government which benefits our residents now and far into the future with community sustainability initiatives which are easy to replicate and affordable to implement; and

WHEREAS, in an attempt to focus attention on the issue of sustainability, the Township Committee wishes to establish a Sustainable Kingwood Team; and

WHEREAS, the Sustainable Kingwood Team shall seek funding through grants and any other sources that become available, as well as use volunteers and local community groups to meet the goals of sustainability in Kingwood; and

WHEREAS, renewable power, changes to fleet purchasing and maintenance, and operational changes will all be considered as the Township moves to do its share to lessen the environmental impact of its operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood that we do hereby establish a Sustainable Kingwood Team consisting of members who shall be residents or employees of Kingwood Township, appointed annually, but whose initial term of appointment shall be through December 31, 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood that the Mission, Goals and Objectives for the Sustainable Kingwood Team through December 31, 2009 are established as follows:

Mission

The Sustainable Kingwood Team will lead and coordinate the sustainability initiatives and activities of Kingwood Township.

Goals

1. Submit a grant application for an energy audit grant from the Board of Public Utilities (BPU) by 7/31/09 and submit formal applications for any grants approved.

- 2. Submit the pre-application for the Local Government Greenhouse Gas Reduction Grant Program by 7/31/09.
- 3. Complete the following action items by 12/31/009:
 - a) Green Purchasing Program
 - b) Water Conservation Ordinance
 - c) Energy Audit

Objectives

- 1. Collaborate with local community groups and organizations, local businesses, schools, emergency services organizations and township committees, commissions and boards to achieve tasks set forth in the Sustainable Jersey program.
- 2. Recommend ordinances designed to meet sustainability goals.
- 3. Review and prioritize the action items needed for Kingwood Township to become certified in the Sustainable Jersey program, recognizing that certification is only the first step in Kingwood Township’s long term sustainability plan.

2009 Pond Management Program – Great Blue

Deputy Mayor Burke briefly explained what the program involved, and that the Parks and Recreation Committee requested that the Township Committee review the proposal and possibly sign up for the full year maintenance program. He noted that the Township has a choice to add barley bundles to the pond or sign a yearly contract with Great Blue at the price of \$800.00 for four treatments to keep the pond clear of algae. He stated that currently the Township has Great Blue perform treatments on the pond only as needed. He stated that it has been treated approximately once or twice a year at the price of \$225.00 a treatment. He explained that if the Township signed up for a year contract, the Township would save \$100.00. Mayor Niemann asked how effective the barley bundles would be to clear up the pond. Township resident, Jack MacConnell stated that the barley is very effective. Mr. MacConnell offered to put the barley bundles in the pond for treatment for the Township. Mayor Niemann noted that we will try the barley for a year, and if it is not successful then the Township will consider signing up with Great Blue Management Program. She thanked Mr. MacConnell for helping the Township.

River-To-Sea Relay Race

Mayor Niemann reviewed letter from the River-To-Sea Administrative Office and noted that this is a handicap relay race with approximately 100 runners. They will be running on the roads of Kingwood Township from 7:00a.m. – 11:00a.m. They have submitted a certificate of liability insurance for that day.

NMS Bike MS

Mayor Niemann reviewed the letter from the National Multiple Sclerosis Society's New Jersey Metro Chapter. The race raises funds to support the Society's mission of ending the effects of MS. This annual event is scheduled for Sunday, September 27, 2009 with approximately 250 riders and volunteers. They are requesting permission to ride through Kingwood Township. They have provided a planned route and a Certificate of Liability Insurance. The Committee members approved and gave their permission for the event.

8TH Annual Tube for the Cause

Deputy Mayor Burke announced that the 8th Annual Tube for Cause, a benefit for breast cancer research will take place on Saturday, August 1, 2009. He explained that registration will be at 10:30a.m. located at the Frenchtown Roller Rink. The cost for tubing is \$20.00 which includes lunch.

West Hunterdon Animal Welfare Non-Profit

Mayor Niemann explained that the West Hunterdon Animal Welfare Non-Profit Organization has asked the Township for a donation. She explained that they have been supporting the Township's efforts to control the feral cat population. The Mayor addressed the Township Attorney in reference to questions of the use of funds from the Dog Animal Fund to use for a donation. Mayor Niemann noted she spoke to the Township's Auditor and he recommended speaking to the Township Attorney. Attorney Kopen noted that she would like to look into this further and inform the Committee members with the correct information for the August meeting. C.F.O. Laudenbach noted that there is a balance of \$4,000.00 in the Dog License account.

Official Thank You

Mayor Niemann wanted to officially thank Jack MacConnell and Anthony Hauck for the generous donation of the aerial view of the Township, which is mounted in the conference room in the municipal offices downstairs. She noted that it really brightens up the room.
