PUBLIC COMMENT / PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Rich Covert – 128 Barbertown Point Breeze Road – Came to the meeting to inquire about obtaining a permit to raise pigs, horses and cows on a residential lot for two acres or more. He contacted the Zoning Officer and Construction Official to find out more information. The Zoning Officer told Mr. Covert there is a document he would provide him with from the State, which would include instructions how to manage the animals on a residential lot. Mr. Covert read the ordinance online to see if there is a permit required and a process to follow. He read aloud what the State suggests for the amount of acreage for each animal.

Attorney Katrina Campbell reviewed the township's ordnance for pigs, which states 10 pigs are the limit any additional needs a permit. Mr. Covert explained in the State article document, they recommend a manure management process. Mr. Covert asked who would manage this process and the process to obtain a permit. The Township Committee explained the resident would need to go through the State for this process.

The Township Committee thanked Rich Covert for attending the meeting.

RESOLUTION TO AMEND RESOLUTION NO. 2020 – 78 SUPPORT OF AERIAL LINE HIGH SPEED INTERNET SERVICE

WHEREAS, rural areas of the State of New Jersey are serviced by service providers with respect to aerial line high-speed internet service; and

WHEREAS, having access to aerial line high-speed internet service is a necessary and vital part of living in today's society; and

WHEREAS, the recent pandemic of COVID-19 further illustrates just how vital access to aerial line high-speed internet has become to society, especially during times of crisis or emergencies and how not having access to aerial line high-speed internet has the potential to cripple a community, particularly a rural one, denying the community the capacity for remote student learning and remote working arrangements with a resident's employer;

AND FURTHERMORE, that during a time of crisis not having access to aerial line high-speed internet has the potential to shut down all functions of government by denying essential employees and elected officials from the ability to work, communicate, distribute information, conduct meetings, and perform the other requirements of a functioning government through remote capabilities; and

WHEREAS, Kingwood Township believes that the service providers of aerial line high-speed internet in the State of New Jersey are more than capable of and financially sound enough to achieve a 100% rate of aerial line high-speed internet accessibility but choose not to pursue that goal unless forced to through regulation because the providers feel it is not profitable; and

WHEREAS, not having access to aerial line high-speed internet service is a plight on students, reducing their educational opportunities and ability to learn in a modern world; and

WHEREAS, not having access to aerial line high-speed internet service could potentially have life and death consequences for the elderly or those with various health complications; and

WHEREAS, not having access to aerial line high-speed internet service causes a great burden to businesses, places them at a disadvantage, and reduces chances for economic development in rural areas; and

WHEREAS, not having access to aerial line high-speed internet service can cause rural healthcare facilities to shut down because they cannot access required networks to function, thereby further creating negative impacts on New Jersey residents' health; and

- WHEREAS, Kingwood Township's successful commitment to farmland preservation has delivered to Kingwood Township the unintended penalty of being good stewards of the environment through farmland preservation while preventing Kingwood Township from ever having the population density to cost-justify a telecommunications infrastructure build out in the Township; and
- WHEREAS, nearly 92.83% of Kingwood Township is zoned for agricultural use and, 10.08% of the agriculturally zoned lands have already been enrolled in permanent farmland preservation with more farms in the preservation pipeline; and
- WHEREAS, Kingwood Township's good stewardship of the environment by according a high priority to farmland and open space preservation should be rewarded, not penalized, with some <u>quid pro quo</u> consideration requiring deployment of aerial line high-speed internet access to the farms, businesses and residents of Kingwood Township; and
- WHEREAS, other rural municipalities experience this same burden due to their rural characteristics and environmental stewardship; and
- WHEREAS, Kingwood Township is desirous of assisting and cooperating with other public entities and State officials to pursue a petition before the Board of Public Utilities to enact regulations requiring a 100% rate of aerial line high-speed internet accessibility in each individual municipality throughout the State of New Jersey; and
- WHEREAS, unless the Board of Public Utilities requires service providers of aerial line high-speed internet to provide 100% aerial line high-speed internet access in Kingwood Township and all municipalities throughout New Jersey, the State will have unintentionally subverted the public's significant investment in farmland and open space preservation by not allowing those preserved farm businesses to be economically competitive and viable over the long term.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood in County of Hunterdon that the Board of Public Utilities is requested to order all service providers of aerial line high-speed internet to provide aerial line high-speed internet service to all municipalities throughout the State with each municipality being afforded a 100% rate of aerial line high-speed internet accessibility; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that our State representatives use their authority to require service providers of aerial line high-speed internet to achieve a 100% rate of high-speed internet access for each individual municipality throughout the State of New Jersey; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Clerk for the Township of Kingwood be directed to send a copy of this resolution to the Governor of the State of New Jersey, the Senate President of the New Jersey State Senate, the Speaker of the Assembly of the State of New Jersey, the Hunterdon County Board of Chosen Freeholders, and the Board of Public Utilities; and

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE KINGWOOD TOWNSHIP EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK

WHEREAS, the Township of Kingwood has reviewed the current Township Employee Handbook and Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee desires to amend the Employee Handbook and Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual by adding a new content "NO SMOKING POLICY"; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Committee of the Township of Kingwood, County of Hunterdon, that the Kingwood Township Employee Handbook and Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual adding the following new content:

NO SMOKING POLICY:

The New Jersey Legislature has declared that in all governmental buildings the rights of non-smokers to breathe clean air supersedes the rights of smokers. In accordance with State law, the Township has adopted a smoke-free policy for all buildings. Township facilities shall be smoke-free and no employee or visitor will be permitted to smoke anywhere in Township buildings. Employees are permitted to smoke only outside Township buildings and such locations as not to allow the re-entry of smoke into building entrances. Smoking inside vehicles owned by the Township and near equipment that may be sensitive to smoke is also prohibited. This policy shall be strictly enforced and any employee found in violation will be subject to disciplinary action.

EMC, Jack MacConnell was present to give his report for June, 2020. He noted the township can obtain a backpack held sprayer at a low cost to spray all the buildings. J. MacConnell brought a brochure for the Township Committee to review. He feels that this would be a good idea for the township to purchase this sprayer. He commented on the storms last evening and many people lost power in Kingwood for several hours. J. MacConnell requested to post on the website for the public to be informed that it is going to be a very warm summer and to conserve water, and to be careful of the dry areas to prevent fires.

- J. MacConnell, noted anyone entering the State of New Jersey coming from a warmer state, should be quarantined for 14 days or get a test to be cleared.
- J. MacConnell would like notification from companies, the county or anyone else regarding herbicides, which are being sprayed on township properties. He stated it is very dangerous for the animals. Attorney K. Campbell to write a letter to Stan Prater representative from Jersey Central Power and Light Co., and request a notification when herbicides are sprayed along township roads or township properties.

Calls Received By Telecom for Discussion of Resolution No. 2020-86 and Resolution No. 2020 - 87

Bob Hornby CADB Administrator from the Hunterdon County Agricultural Development Board and Liz Schmid Open Space Coordinator and CADB Liaison for the township were present by telecom to explain the two following resolutions.
