# PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING MINUTES June 7, 2023 7:00PM

#### Privilege of the Floor

Frank Floyd, Kingwood Twp. Office of Emergency Management Coordinator (OEM) reported that that he is currently in discussion with the Township Engineer regarding two coverts near Horseshoe Bend East which were damaged during Hurricane Ida. Mr. Floyd is applying for FEMA money for either the repair or replacement of these coverts. Although the previous Township Engineer recommended repairing the covert at approximately \$145,000 the current Engineer is recommending replacement at approximately \$400,000. Due to the significant difference in cost the Township would have to successfully justify to FEMA the reasons the covert must be replaced.

Speaking as the Kingwood Township Volunteer Fire Department Chief, Mr. Floyd reported that the Smoke Detector Replacement program is in process. They will be distributing flyers at

senior meetings, through the Kingwood School electronic backpack system and on Community Day.

#### Horseshoe Bend Park Update

Jack MacConnell reported that a few members of the Kingwood Environmental Committee came out to Horseshoe Ben Park to help identify and clean out some invasive species. It was an excellent workgroup made up by; Mara Tippett, Debbie Kratzer and Ralph Celebre,

There has been no mowing at the Park due to the current drought situation.

Department of Public Works crew is repairing the tops of the picnic tables at Horseshoe Bend Park.

J. MacConnell requested that he and R. Dodds be added to the Hunterdon Communications notification list. They would like to be called any time there is an incident at Horseshoe Bend Park. Frank Floyd, OEM, stated he would speak with Mayor Russano but also stated that since he is on the notification list he can call them to alert them of an issue as long as there would be no breach of privacy.

Mr. MacConnell thanked the entire Parks and Recreation Committee for coming out to help fill holes at the Leash Free Dog area at the Park in May.

Vivian Rice spoke to the Committee regarding the Leash Free Dog area concerns about the possible removal of the benches from inside the area due to people bringing their dogs to run loose while they sit on the benches and socialize.

Ms. Rice is a regular user of the Leash Free area and was aware that the Committee met to fill holes in May purportedly made by unattended dogs digging out. She thinks the holes were made by fox or other animal that could get into the area and then would have to dig their way back out. Ms. Rice stated that most people watch their dogs and although there are a few people who can't walk the area due to age or other disability they have someone else walk their dog/dogs for them

while they sit on the benches. She did state, however, that there are some people that do not watch their dogs very well.

Ms. Rice commented on the poor condition of the benches. C. Kolvites stated that the benches were set in areas with stone to keep them from soaking in the wet ground but people choose to move them and not put them back on the stone which is why they are deteriorating.

- R. Dodds asked Ms. Rice if there is something that the Parks & Recreation Committee could do to improve the situation at the Dog area. She responded that unless someone is there all the time it's not going to be possible to maintain full compliance with the rules.
- M. Bydalek recommended that all but two of the inside benches be removed and put around the perimeter to discourage socializing inside the Leash Free area. D. Hewitt suggested getting concrete benches that are anchored so that they can't be moved around.

The Committee determined to table this topic to the July 5<sup>th</sup> meeting. In the mean-time it was suggested that a survey be placed on the website for feedback from the Leash Free Dog area users.
