Horseshoe Bend Park Update

Leash Free Dog Area topic tabled to the October 4, 2023 meeting.

J. MacConnell reported that a person had called to report a group of bumblebees that were located by the Leash Free Dog Area gate. She felt that the bees were a danger to people and animals. Mr. MacConnell informed her that they did not pose a serious danger and we were not able to kill the bees. He did let the person know that there is another dog park on Rt. 12 in

Raritan Township. Mr. MacConnell alerted D. Hewitt to the complaint who call the woman. He informed her that we could not spray a pesticide in a public location without proper public notification. He also explained that the bees are necessary to the plant as pollinators. He let her know that it is a short period of time that they will be a nuisance. The person was satisfied with this information.

The Committee reviewed a report submitted by the NJ Mycological Association of the results of their mushroom foray at Horseshoe Bend Park on July 30th. R. Dodds questioned secretary Walters why this organization did not have to submit a Facility Use Agreement. She explained that this was not a public event, no fees were collected from attendees and no reservations were required. Private groups are permitted to use open space without a signed agreement.

R. Dodds requested that all Facility Use Applications be submitted to the Parks and Recreation Committee in advance.
