#### Privilege of the Floor

Lance Riggio, speaking on behalf of the Township Committee, thanked the entire Parks and Recreation Committee for the excellent team work on bringing forth a great Community Day for the residents of Kingwood.

Frank Floyd, OEM, stated that the communication during Community Day was excellent and all went well regardless of the obstacles that the previous week's weather provided.

Mr. Floyd updated the Committee on theHorseshoe Bend Park East Covert. The pricing for repair vs replacement has been adjusted. A new cost of \$190,000 to replace the bridge has been

obtained but they still awaiting updated cost for repair. If that cost comes in between \$215,000. - \$265,000 matching funds would be available.

R. Dodds stated that the Community Day event was really well done. There was on average 212 cars in and out all day/evening
