PUBLIC COMMENT - PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

<u>Charles Kolvites</u>, <u>Barcroft Road</u> – Came to express his feelings regarding the Old Fairview School House. He feels that the school house has been around for over 100 years. Many residents have been to school there and it means a lot to them. He noted that there is a lot of talk on Facebook regarding the selling of the historical building. He feels that the Township should have a public meeting possibly outside at the Horseshoe Bend Park to give the residents a chance to give their opinion on the auction of the school house before it is auctioned to be sold.

Beth Pandy, Spring Hill Rd. – Came to express her feelings regarding the Township auctioning off the Old Fairview School. She stated that it is a historical building that has been here for many years and is still the same original building. The building means a lot to many of the residents here in Kingwood. She feels that the Township is doing a great job preserving farm land, and asked that the history of the town be preserved also.

Mayor Dodds noted the Old Fairview School has not been sold yet. He noted that there is a resolution authorizing the sale of the Old Fairview School on the Consent Agenda, which he will request it be removed for discussion. He stated everyone is invited to stay for the discussion during that part of the meeting.

<u>Wayne Ingram - Township Engineer</u> - Present at the meeting by conference call to speak to the Township Committee regarding - Ridge Road Section II and Warsaw Road Projects - Cost Estimates

Ridge Road - Wayne Ingram noted he put together an estimate. He asked the Committee Members if they wanted to cut costs on the project. The Township Committee suggested that a representative from the Department of Public Works meet with Wayne Ingram, Township Engineer to discuss new prices. It was suggested to pave less of Ridge Road than was originally planned. Committee Members asked Wayne Ingram to contact DPW General Foreman, Michael Ewing.

<u>Warsaw Road</u> – Wayne Ingram gave an analysis of the grant funds for Warsaw Road. He suggested the Township review their budget amount to spend on the project. The Committee Members noted they only would like to spend what is in the grant amount.

Emergency Management Report – January 2021

EMC, Irving MacConnell, Reported on 122 total cases of COVID-19 in Kingwood Township. He noted there was a State of emergency on 1-31-2021, due to the recent snow storm. WHEREAS, the Township of Kingwood is the owner of Block 14, Lot 43 (more commonly known as 12 Fairview Road) of which is not needed for public use and the Township Committee has determined that it is in the best interest of the Township to sell the property in an effort to put it back on the active tax rolls; and

WHEREAS, there shall be no minimum bid for this property. The Township reserves the right to set a minimum bid before the auction. Regardless of the minimum bid the Township reserves the right to reject all bids; and

WHEREAS, the Township has hired Max Spann Real Estate & Auction Co. to market and auction the property on its behalf.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF KINGWOOD, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, that the property described as Block 14, Lot 43, more commonly known as 12 Fairview Road within the Township of Kingwood shall be offered for sale by open public sale at auction to the highest bidder, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-12(a). Said public auction shall be conducted electronically on March 3, 2021 at 11 am through Max Spann's website www.maxspann.com

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the subject property shall be offered for public bidding as set forth below and shall be sold pursuant to the further expressed conditions enumerated below:

- The Township has hired Max Spann Real Estate & Auction Co. to market and conduct a public auction for the above referenced properties. Buyer will pay Max Spann Real Estate & Auction Co. a Buyer's Premium Commission in the amount of 10% of the bid price. Buyer's premium will be incorporated into the purchase price. The Contract price in the purchase agreement shall be 110% of the high bid.
- The Township reserves the right to cancel the auction or remove a property from the auction list, at any time
 prior to the auction, for any reason. Bidders may wish to contact Max Spann Real Estate & Auction Co. the

- All conveyances shall be by Bargain and Sale Deed from the Township of Kingwood to the successful bidder, to be dated on the date of closing of title.
- 14. The sale price, as may result from this auction sale, may not be used before any County Board of Taxation, State Tax Court of in any other court of this State to challenge the assessment with respect to the subject property nor may same be used as a comparable sale to challenge assessment with regard to other properties.

NEW BUSINESS

<u>TDR - David Roberts</u> – from DG Roberts Planning and Design, LLC was present at the meeting to discuss the Township's (TDR) Transfer of Development Rights Program. This is a plan for preserving rural character through controlled development along State Hwy. Route 12.

Mr. Roberts reviewed the TDR Plan for 2018 – Plan Endorsement Process, which includes the Plan Element, Initial Plan Endorsement, Scope of Plan, Affordable Housing, Land Use, Relationship of Project and Key Policy Issues, Population Growth and Changing Demographics, Visioning and Planning Objectives and the Eastern Gateway Village Center Overlay (EGVCO).

Mr. Roberts explained they are currently at step 3 of 9 at the end of 2020 and they were able to discuss business over a zoom meeting with state representatives. There are a number of areas where the Township is in good shape with the State. A plus is that the Township participates in the Sustainable Jersey Program. Mr. Roberts recommended designating the Sustainable Kingwood Team, to be the board to look over the plans.

Mr. Roberts noted the next step is to review the municipal assessment and the component where the township works with the State. Agencies intertwine and work together to let the Township know what they need to complete. He noted they would like to do meetings virtually with the Township's Planning Board and one meeting with Township Committee to discuss an action plan. The final project is to endorse the Township and to finalize the zoning, and a plan that will cover affordable housing. He plans to work on a mapping component with the Township Planner. Mr. Roberts noted he will need a copy of the Township's Natural Resource Inventory.

The Township Committee requested David Roberts contact the Township Planner, David Banisch and inquire if he has done other towns plan endorsements. C.F.O. Diane Laudenbach asked if there would be additional costs. Mr. Roberts noted the Township Planner will need to work on maps for this project, therefore it is likely there will be additional costs.

There were questions and answers between the Township Committee and Mr. Roberts. The Township Committee recommended David Roberts attend the next Township's Planning Board Meeting.

The Township Committee thanked David Roberts for coming to the meeting.

Township Committee Liaison Monthly Reports

Deputy Mayor, Ciacciarelli, reported everything seems to be going well so far this year.

Committeewoman Syrnick, reported on the Open Space/Ag meeting. She noted the Ely property is looking to preserve. The Environmental Commission – submitted their objectives for the year of what they want to accomplish. They want to continue outreach with the public. Chair, Debbie Kratzer would like to have access to the Township website to post the Environmental Commission's announcements. The EC would also like to work with those from the Parks and Recreation regarding Horseshoe Bend Park and the trails. The Sustainable Kingwood Team would like to work on keeping a bronze status.

Mayor Dodds, reported Parks and Recreation and Environmental Commission Member Mara Tippett did a lot of work on the Outer Spatial App, which the Township received a grant. It will help those to follow along on the trails in the Horseshoe Bend Park. The information on the app will be on the Kingwood Township website. Regarding the playground funding, the Township cannot use the grant funds until the 2021 budget is adopted. The Township would like to start construction in April of this year. The Department of Public Works are planning to do the groundwork. The Township will be adopting an ordinance to accept the funds for the grant and to allow for the expenditure.

Mayor Dodds noted the Hunterdon County Planning Board worked on GIS parcel maps for several towns in the County, and one was for Kingwood Twp.

When can employee return to work after testing positive for COVID-19

- 10 days after they started showing symptoms.
- 10 days after clinical stability or when a patient no longer needs oxygen support in cases of severe disease.
- Testing for COVID-19 is not required for the return to work (exception: if a
 person remains asymptomatic in quarantine after a high-risk exposure to a confirmed
 COVID-19 case. A test should be done when assessing the employee for early return to
 work on day 8 post-exposure.
