# LOCAL REVIEW OF THE 2021 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

WHEREAS, NJSA 40A:4-78b has authorized the Local Finance Board to adopt rules that permit municipalities in sound fiscal condition to assume the responsibility, normally granted to the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, of conducting the annual budget examination, and

WHEREAS, NJAC 5:30-7 was adopted by the Local Finance Board on February 11, 1997, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to NJAC 5:30-7.2 thru 7.5 the Township of Kingwood has been declared eligible to participate in the program by the Division of Local Government Services, and the Chief Financial Officer has determined that the Township meets the necessary conditions to participate in the program for the 2021 budget year.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood that the in accordance with NJAC 5:307.6 a & b and based upon the Chief Financial Officers certification. The Township Committee has found the budget has met the following requirements:

- That with reference to the following items, the amounts have been calculated pursuant to law and appropriated as such in the budget:
  - a. Payment of interest and debt redemption charges
  - b. Deferred charges and statutory expenditures
  - c. Cash deficit of preceding year
  - Reserve for uncollected taxes
  - e. Other reserves and non-disbursement items
  - f. Any inclusions of amounts required for school purposes
- 2. That the provisions relating to limitation on increases of appropriations pursuant to NJSA 40A:4-45.2 and appropriations for exceptions to limits on appropriations found at 40A:4-45.3 et seq. are fully met (Complies with the "CAP" law).
- That the budget is in such form, arrangement, and content as required by the Local Budget Law and NJAC 5:30-4 and 5:30-5.
- 4. That pursuant to the Local Budget Law:
  - All estimates of revenue are reasonable, accurate, and correctly stated
  - b. Items of appropriation are properly set forth
  - c. In itemization, form, arrangement, and content the budget will permit the exercise of the comptroller function within the municipality

- 5. The budget and associated amendments have been introduced, publicly advertised, and adopted in accordance with the relevant provisions of the Local Budget Law, except that failure to meet the deadlines of NJSA 40A:4-5 shall not prevent such certification.
- That all other applicable statutory requirements have been fulfilled.

WHEREAS, the Township's fire chief shall understand that no local Mutual Aid agreement(s) shall supersede any New Jersey or Pennsylvania state regulation or statute, eg., County Mutual Aid plan, N.J. Deployment Act, or any other emergency management regulations; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood, in the County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey, as follows

- The Township of Kingwood hereby authorizes the fire chief to enter into Mutual Aid agreements with other area fire departments. These Mutual Aid agreements shall be presented to the Township Committee upon adoption and thereafter kept on file with the Township Clerk and within the office of the Township's Fire Chief;

# Township Committee Liaison Monthly Reports

Committeewoman Syrnick, Liaison - Open Space Committee/Environmental Commission - Reported the Environmental Commission is reviewing information on the current well ordinance. They formed a subcommittee to do research. The Commission Members have data on the reports. Committeewoman Syrnick recommended they gather information and send to the Township Engineer for review.

Open Space/Agricultural Advisory Committees – These Committees work very efficiently, and there are several properties which have been discussed to be preserved.

<u>Deputy Mayor Ciacciarelli</u>, Liaison - Municipal Offices/Employees- Made a recommendation to change the scheduled work days in the office for the Township Clerk and Deputy Clerk. He explained it seems as though one person would be in for several days at a time, and the other person would not be in for several days. He feels it would be best to schedule the clerks to come in every other day. This way the Township Committee can keep track of who will be in the office each day.

Opening the Municipal building to the public was discussed. Deputy Mayor Ciacciarelli noted that the majority of the public is still not vaccinated and there are several different variances of the virus out there. He suggested to keep the building closed to the public for the present time. As far as the employees working together, not all the employees are vaccinated at the present time and those who have received the vaccine have not reached that timeframe to allow immunity. The Township will revisit the discussion regarding employees working together at next month's meeting.

Deputy Mayor Ciacciarelli noted the EEOC is working on guidelines with reference to vaccinations for employees and information for employers who could require employees to be vaccinated. He feels the Township should wait until that information comes out before making any decisions.

Mayor Dodds commented by next month the Township Committee should be able to make a decision regarding the employees who work during the day and when they can begin working together if everyone is vaccinated. He feels it may even be a good idea for everyone to come into the building to work, but separate and possibly work upstairs and two employees downstairs. The Township Committee all agreed to discuss this further next month.

Mayor Dodds, Liaison – Parks and Recreation Committee – Noted the new playground equipment has not been installed yet at the Kingwood Park. He explained it should be installed by the company they purchased it from, as soon as, they have the opportunity to work on it.

There was a discussion regarding the location of where the new playground was going to be installed. Committeewoman Syrnick feels where the new playground is proposed to be installed, is much too close to the pavilion. The concern is, that it maybe too loud for those who rent the pavilion for weddings, showers and other private events.

Mayor Dodds noted that the Parks and Recreation Committee discussed the location and thought this would be the best place to install the playground and explained there is shade from the trees nearby. Mayor Dodds reviewed what was discussed with the Parks and Rec. Committee regarding the need for a Park Director, who had the responsibility to open up the pavilion and get it ready for those renting the area for events. Park and Rec. Chairman, David Hewitt opened it up and closed the pavilion for the last event. Mayor Dodds noted we do not have a Park Director and feels the township needs someone in this position. He spoke to the Park and Rec. members and asked them how they would like to handle the situation. They will give it some thought, and discuss this further at their next meeting. He would like them to come to the Township Committee to present their ideas. Volunteers are now unlocking and locking the bathrooms on the weekends at Kingwood Park.

Mayor Dodds explained speaking to General Foreman, Michael Ewing, who has informed him the trail around the Kingwood Park near the stream has become eroded. He obtained price quotations for the stone to be installed on the trail. The cost to be approximately \$3,000.00. There was a discussion on how the Township would pay for this project. C.F.O. Diane Laudenbach noted that the Open Space Trust Fund is the account it will be paid out of. Mayor Dodds will instruct the DPW, General Foreman to purchase the stone for the trail.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood, County of Hunterdon, State of New Jersey that Substance Abuse/Use Policy, of the Township of Kingwood Personnel Policies and Procedures Manual, be amended as follows and attached hereto:

#### SUBSTANCE ABUSE/USE POLICY

This policy applies to all employees of the Township while on the job and to situations wherein an employee's off-the-job or off-premises conduct impairs work performance or undermines the public confidence in, or harms the reputation of, the Township.

It is the goal of the Township to:

- Provide a safe workplace by eliminating the hazards to health and job safety created by alcohol and drug abuse; and
- Balance our respect for individuals with the need to maintain a safe, productive and drug-free environment.

The Township is committed to providing a safe work environment and to fostering the well-being and health of its employees. That commitment is jeopardized when any employee of the Township illegally uses alcohol, **cannabis** or illegal drugs on the job, comes to work under their influence, or possesses, distributes or sells **cannabis** or illegal drugs in the workplace. The intent of this policy is to offer a helping hand to those who need it, while sending a clear message that the illegal use of drugs is incompatible with employment at the Township. This policy is established for the Township in accordance with the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988.

#### Definitions

- a. The term "illegal drug" means a controlled substance, the possession or use of which is unlawful, pursuant to the laws of any state, county, or local laws and regulations in the United States.
- b. Controlled substances that are not legally obtainable, or that are legally obtainable but have not been legally obtained, are illegal drugs. Examples include controlled dangerous substances, which are illegal no matter how they are obtained, such as cocaine, heroin, phencyclidine; and controlled legal substances that have been illegally obtained or used other than as prescribed such as opioids, amphetamines, methamphetamines, and barbiturates.
- c. The term "controlled substance abuse" includes prescribed drugs not being used for prescribed purposes or in a prescribed manner.

#### Cannabis Use

The Township may not take adverse action against an employee for the personal use of cannabis outside of working hours, so long as the employee is not intoxicated or impaired during working hours. Adverse action includes the refusal to hire or employ any person or to discharge from employment or take any other adverse action against any employee with respect to compensation, terms, conditions, or other privileges of employment because that person does or does not smoke, vape, aerosolize or otherwise use cannabis items. In addition, an employee may not be subject to any adverse action by the Township solely due to the presence of cannabinoid metabolites in the employee's bodily fluid from engaging in conduct permitted under State law. In other words, the Township may not take adverse action against an employee if the employee's drug test is positive for cannabis, unless that employee is intoxicated or impaired during working hours.

As part of the Township's effort to maintain a workplace free of substance abuse, employees may be asked to submit to drug testing, in compliance with and to the extent permitted under State law, to determine and confirm whether employees are currently impaired by cannabis while working on the job. The Township may use the results of this drug test to determine the appropriate employment action concerning the employee.

All employees continue to be subject to and are required to follow all Federal and State regulations and law regarding cannabis in connection with their employment.

#### Prohibited Conduct

- a. It is a violation of Township policy to sell, offer to sell, buy, offer to buy, possess, distribute, use or be under the influence of alcohol, <u>cannabis</u> or any illegal drug, or to engage in controlled substance abuse, while at work at any location, on Township premises at any time, or when operating any Township vehicle, tools or equipment.
- b. It is a violation of Township policy for employees to use prescription drugs illegally. However, nothing in this policy precludes the appropriate use of legally prescribed medications.
- Employees who engage in such prohibited conduct will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.

#### 6.17.4 Employee Responsibilities

Each employee has the responsibility to:

- a. Report to work at all times free of alcohol, cannabis or illegal drugs and their effects; and
- Support the Township's efforts to eliminate alcohol, <u>cannabis</u> and other drug abuse among employees where it exists.
- c. As a condition of employment, employees must abide by the terms of this policy and must notify the Township, in writing, of any conviction of a violation of a criminal drug statute occurring in the workplace no later than five (5) calendar days after such conviction.

#### Testing

a. Applicants: All job applicants receiving conditional offers of employment will undergo testing for the presence of illegal drugs as a condition of employment. Any applicant with a confirmed positive test result will be denied employment. The Township will not discriminate against applicants for employment because of a past history of substance abuse. Therefore, individuals who have failed a pre-employment test may initiate another inquiry for employment with the Township after a period of no less than six (6) months, but must present themselves drug and alcohol free.

- b. Employees: Drug and alcohol testing shall be conducted on employees:
  - 1. In cases where reasonable suspicion of alcohol use, illegal drug use or controlled substance abuse in violation of this policy exists unless testing is required for certain positions by State or Federal statute. The determination that reasonable suspicion exists must be based upon specific, contemporaneous, observations that can be articulated concerning the appearance, behavior, speech or body odors of the employee. The observations may include indications of the chronic use of, and/or withdrawal from, the effects of controlled substances. Adverse action against an employee for off duty conduct shall not be taken unless such conduct directly impairs the employee's on-the-job performance. Or,
  - When employees are involved in on-the-job accidents where personal injury or damage to Township property occurs. Or,
  - 3. As part of any follow-up program to treatment for drug abuse.

### Investigations

Whenever the Township, during the course of an investigation by the Administrator, has reasonable suspicion that an employee is under the influence of alcohol, <u>cannabis</u> or illegal drugs, or in the case of applicant testing, then the following procedure shall immediately be applied:

- a. Prior to testing, the employee or applicant will be asked to sign an approved form agreeing to the testing, authorizing the release of test results to the Administrator and authorizing the disclosure of the results to any other persons the Administrator determines needs to know for the safety and welfare of the other employees and the residents of the Township. An employee or applicant who refuses to sign the authorization shall be subject to immediate discharge.
- b. The employee shall be prevented from engaging in further work and shall be instructed to wait for a reasonable amount of time until the employee can be transported to a designated location where a drug and/or alcohol test will be conducted. Testing shall be conducted in a manner that preserves the employee's privacy, yet ensures the integrity of the specimen collection process. An employee or applicant who refuses to submit to testing, or properly comply with the testing procedures, shall be subject to immediate discharge.
- c. The Township will afford the applicant and/or employee subject to testing the opportunity, prior to testing, to list all prescription and non-prescription medications and controlled substances they have used and to explain the circumstances surrounding the uses of such medications and controlled substances. Failure of any employee or applicant to establish adequately a legal basis for the use of any illegal drug or controlled substance with respect to which the employee tests positive shall constitute a violation of this policy.

- d. The Township's officers, agents and representatives may use test result information in connection with Township business and for purposes of employment and disciplinary actions, and disclose it when required to government agencies and to others upon valid legal requests, legal proceedings and other situations to protect the interests of and otherwise in accordance with policies on employee data.
- e. An employee who tests positive for illegal drugs, <u>cannabis</u> or alcohol <u>while working on the job</u> will be subject to disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.
  - An applicant who tests positive for illegal drugs will not be hired. If the Township has a good faith belief that an employee has tampered with, adulterated, diluted, or substituted his/her sample, or has attempted to do any of the foregoing, the employee will be subject to immediate discharge.
- f. The Township, prior to taking any disciplinary action, will give all employees who test positive the opportunity for a hearing. Adequate notice shall be given to the employee prior to the hearing.
- g. The Township will establish and maintain any and all additional testing programs and requirements that may be necessary or appropriate to comply with appropriate rules and regulations of all governments.

#### Hearing

Upon receipt of a request for a hearing by an employee who tests positive for alcohol, <u>cannabis</u>, illegal drugs or controlled substances, and upon receipt of the completed investigative report, the Administrator shall conduct a hearing with notice to the employee. The employee shall be notified, in writing, at least ten (10) days before the hearing of the matter. The employee may request one (1) postponement of the hearing upon receipt of the notice in order to obtain legal counsel, however, the delay occasioned by such request shall not exceed thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of the notice by the accused employee.

It is recommended that the accused employee seek legal counsel.

The employee shall be entitled to attend the hearing and testify on his/her own behalf. If allegations were made by another employee against the accused employee, the accused employee shall be entitled to confront and cross-examine that employee, unless legitimate grounds exist to preclude such cross-examination.

The employee shall be entitled to call witnesses on his/her own behalf and to introduce evidence which bears upon the issues presented by the investigative report.

At the conclusion of the hearing, the Administrator shall have the sole discretion to impose discipline, which may include the termination of employment of such employee.

Assistance in Overcoming Alcohol, Illegal Drug Use or Controlled Substance Abuse.

It is the responsibility of supervisory personnel to counsel employees whenever they observe changes in performance or behavior that suggest an employee has a drug problem.

Although it is not the supervisor's responsibility to diagnose personal problems, the supervisor should encourage such employees to seek help and advise them about available resources for getting help.

Everyone shares responsibility for maintaining a safe work environment and coworkers should encourage anyone who may have a drug problem to seek help. Employees with alcohol, drug or controlled substance abuse problems are encouraged to request assistance from the appropriate Supervisor and/or Department Head. Assistance will be provided on a confidential basis, and each employee will be referred to the appropriate treatment and counseling services through the Township medical plan.

## Township Referral

Employees who test positive for alcohol, <u>cannabis</u>, illegal drug use or controlled substance abuse <u>while</u> <u>working on the job</u> and who are referred for counseling or treatment will be limited to one opportunity for counseling or treatment. A second positive test for the use of alcohol, <u>cannabis</u>, illegal drugs or controlled substances may result in immediate termination.

#### Authorized Use of Prescribed Medicine

An employee undergoing prescribed medical treatment with any drug or controlled substance that may impair physical or mental ability shall report this treatment to the Administrator and his/her Department Head. The Administrator, in consultation with the employee and the Department Head, will determine whether the Township should temporarily change the employee's job assignment during the period of treatment.

# Severability

The provisions of this policy are severable and if any of these provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, the decision of such court shall not affect or impair the remaining provisions.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Township Committee of the Township of Kingwood recommends that all employees shall receive a copy of Substance Abuse/Use Policy and be required to acknowledge their understanding of the updated policy by providing their signature.

Deputy Mayor Ciacciarelli reviewed the proposal from Flemington Borough regarding shared court. He noted the Township would need to charge for a security officer. The Flemington Court currently has their own prosecutor. Deputy Mayor Ciacciarelli would like permission to continue to speak to Mayor, Betsy Driver regarding this proposal.

#### Municipal Appointment to Housing Board Member - Leslie Bella

It was moved by Mr. Ciacciarelli, seconded by Miss Syrnick and carried to appoint Leslie Bella as a Citizen Member to the Housing Board for a one-year term. All voted Aye on Roll Call Vote.

A resolution will be prepared for next month for the appoint for Leslie Bella.

# <u>Letter of Support for Local Recreation Improvement Grant – DVRHS Replacement of Current Grass</u> <u>Field for a Turf Surface</u>

Mayor Dodds noted he was contacted by the Mayor of Holland Township. The Delaware Valley Regional High School is looking to put in a turf surface on their football field. The Township Committee would like a letter of support prepared for Mayor Dodds to sign in support of the turf field at DVRHS.

# Letter from NJDEP-Division of Parks and Forestry re: New Riverview Parking Lot - Former DeRewal Site

Mayor Dodds requested the NJDEP send the Township a letter and a map of the proposed plans for the lot on Route 29 along the river, which is where the former building for the Hunterdon Land Trust was located. It has been a parking area for many cars in the summertime. The NJDEP Division of Parks and Forestry plan to make it an official parking lot.

#### 2020 Tax Sale

Attorney K. Campbell to prepare a resolution for next month regarding the 2020 Tax Sale list.

#### Personnel - RICE Notice - Tax Assessor

Attorney K. Campbell reviewed a letter received from the County Tax Board Administrator. The letter is to remind the Township Committee that the job performance of the Assessor is not under supervision of the Township Committee, which means they do not have any ability to discipline for assessing duties. If the Township has any complaints, they must be sent to the County Tax Board. Before the Township can make a complaint to the County, the Township must issue a RICE Notice, and it needs to be discussed whether they would like to make a complaint during a Township Committee meeting.

Attorney K. Campbell noted that Mr. Gill has chosen to have this discussion in public session. She explained the procedures during the meeting to Mr. Gill, and potentially his job performance may be discussed, no action will be taken for discipline. Attorney K. Campbell gave David Gill the option to have this discussion in open or closed session.

David Gill has decided to have the discussion in open session.

Attorney K. Campbell read aloud the following list of complaints received regarding David Gill's performance.

Checks not deposited within 48 hours

Mail not opened up for several weeks

Not putting in complete amount of hours of scheduled work per week

Not using the time clock to clock in and out Not filling out the COVID Sheet and submitting each time entering the Municipal Bldg. Sleeping at desk during office work hours

Attorney K. Campbell reviewed with David Gill the list of complaints and explained to him what is expected from him as the Tax Assessor for Kingwood Township.

There was a discussion regarding Tax Assessor David Gill falling asleep in his office.

David Gill noted he had two computers in his office. The Township took away one of his computers and he would like to have it back. Attorney K. Campbell explained to Mr. Gill, that he was doing other work from other towns on his second computer. She explained there is no sleeping in the office during office hours.

The Township Committee asked Mr. Gill if he had an explanation of why he was sleeping at his desk. Mr. Gill noted he has nothing to do and needs his other computer to keep busy. A picture was brought up over the projector of David Gill sleeping during his evening office hours on March 30, 2021 between 4:30pm – 7:00pm.

Attorney K. Campbell suggested to Mr. Gill that he make a list of items he would like for his office before the budget is discussed so the Township Committee can review and they will address this request.

The Township Committee asked Mr. Gill to do assessments for farmland preservation properties. They asked him if he has completed the task for 2020. Mr. Gill stated no, but he did go on maps and looked up the properties, and also drove by several of them.

Attorney K. Campbell asked David Gill if he had any records that belong to the Township at his home office? He stated he had deeds at his home. The Township Committee insisted Mr. Gill bring all the township records back to be filed in his office.

Mayor Dodds noted it is important that the Township document this discussion this evening and send to the County Tax Board. The Township Committee requested Attorney K. Campbell write a letter to the County documenting this discussion regarding Tax Assessor, David Gill and request discipline be taken.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT/PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR

Resident of the Township, Stuart Freedenfeld from Byram Lane requested to speak to the Committee Members. He would like the Committee Members to instruct the Zoning Officer to enforce the laws. He believes that the political codes are being violated. He explained there are political flags from the last Election put up by a neighbor that are still up on the other side of his home. Attorney K. Campbell explained a case came out since that code was written, which makes it very difficult for the Township to enforce that code against political signs. She explained the Zoning Officer is being very careful, because they are not sure it would uphold in court against political signs, and that it is impossible for the Township to do anything. There is a rule for free speech, but if it is creating a safety concern, then the Township could do something about it.

Mr. Freedenfeld noted the same individual brought in several truckloads of stone, which has affected the water drainage on his property. Attorney K. Campbell suggested that he contact the Hunterdon County Soil Conservation to come inspect this issue.
